



Arthur Albert Prosser was born February 9, 1914 in Chinook, MT, the son of Albert and Florence (Benson) Prosser. He was raised and educated in Chinook, graduating from Chinook High School. Art attended the University of Montana at Missoula, MT and received his Pharmacy Degree.

On November 26, 1941, Art was united in marriage to Florence Weedeman at Columbus, MT. Art worked at pharmacies in Laurel and Columbus, Montana. He entered the U.S. Navy in 1943. The Navy transferred him to the 5th Marine Division. He served as a Corpsman and trained in Hawaii for the planned invasion of Japan. After the Japanese surrender, Art served for 3 months in Japan. He was honorably discharged in 1945.

Art worked for several pharmacies in Montana for several years. He later started the Prosser Drug Store in Ray, which he operated for 45 years. Florence died in 1990. After his retirement Art continued to live in Ray. Art later moved to Tioga Independent Living in Tioga and later entered Tioga Long-Term Care in June of this year, where he has been a resident since.

Art died at Tioga Long-Term Care on Tuesday, December 4, 2007.

Art was an avid sports fan, following all of the Ray Schools sporting activities and enjoyed golfing.

He is survived by one son, Layton (Glenna) Prosser of Ramsey, MN; one daughter, Maxine (Gordon) Lokken of Ray, ND; five grandchildren and seven great-grandchildren; and one sister, Mable Putnam of San Angelo, TX

He was preceded in death by his wife, parents, two brothers, Lee and Frank and a sister, Clara.
