Born on December 14, 1931, Lupe was originally from Savage, MT. Born to Desi and Paula Vallejo, she was the oldest of ten children, Christina Finnicum, Elisa Olsen, Lydia Wandler, Andy Vallejo, Victor Vallejo, Esther Sorensen, Lola Herbert, Roy Vallejo, and Margaret Seigle. In the mid 1950's, she met her first husband, Harold Yelle (1930-1971), while working as a nurse in Taunton, MA. While in Massachusetts, she raised her first son, Harold Yelle II, of Raleigh, NC. Lupe married her second husband, John Chambers (1930-2003) in 1960 and raised her three sons Harold, Eric Chamber, of Raleigh, NC, and David Chamber, of Atlanta, GA. After raising her children, she returned to nursing for 15 years. She worked at Women's Prison and at Peace College in Raleigh until she retired.*
