

On September 23, 1931, Myris Ann was born in Intake, Montana to Arnold and Martha (Deckert) Fay, she was the fourth of nine children. In the spring of 1937, the family moved to Idaho and lived in a small house. Myris said that the kids slept in the attic on the floor because there were no beds, and they drove a Model A. In 1941 the family moved back to Richey, Montana to help with the harvest.

Myris started her education in Idaho, later the family moved to a small town in Montana, where they were able to walk to and from school. She attended Sidney's public schools until the 11th grade. She then worked at Sidney Laundry for 13 years, then moved to Williston, North Dakota and worked at Model Drive-In Cleaners for 22 years until her retirement.

In July 1950, she married Herbert Damm in Culbertson, Montana and they had six children. After Herbert's death in 1968, she married Lynn Sorenson in October 1970. During her marriages she lived in Sidney and Fairview, Montana, Silver Bay, Minnesota, and Williston, North Dakota. She enjoyed camping, boating, fishing, and activities with her husbands and children. They spent many weekends at Trenton Lake enjoying the outdoors with family from the Williston area.

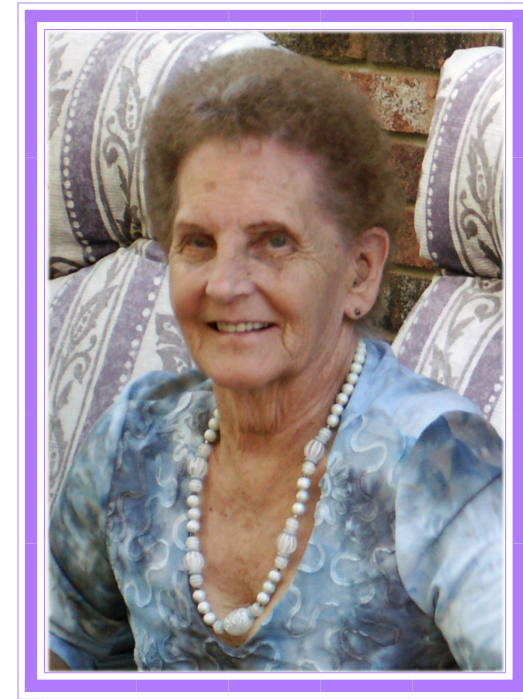
