Dale was born on July 24, 1932, in Fargo, ND. Dale and his parents, Henry and Amanda (Hansen) Andersen, moved to Sidney from Kenmare, ND in 1934. Dale grew up on the family farm north of town. He was confirmed at Pella Lutheran Church and graduated from Sidney High School in 1951. Dale worked for Sun Oil Company in New Mexico for a short while before coming back to the family farm to raise sugar beets and livestock. Dale was married to Margaret Martinson of Sacred Heart, MN in 1954. To this union four children were born. Dale continued to farm north of Sidney and drove the activity bus for Sidney High School. Dale and Margaret divorced in 1983.

Dale later married Delores Mayer. Upon his retirement, Dale and Delores made their homes in Dickinson, ND, Glenville, MN, Joice, IA, Mapleton, IA, Bison, SD, and finally Mott, ND, where they lived for the past ten years. Dale moved to Wibaux, MT after his wife, Delores, passed away in December of 2008.

While living in Sidney, Dale enjoyed the time he spent with his sons, traveling with them and sharing that "Old-Fashioned" spirit. He spent time at his "cowboy" cabin in the hills, enjoying the peace and solitude. Always quick with a joke or funny comment, Dale liked to make people laugh and enjoy themselves.
