If Tears Could Build a Stairway


If tears could build a stairway and thoughts a memory lane I'd walk right up to heaven and bring you home again.

He grew up and attended schools in Billings and was very active in baseball, hockey and football as a child. Damon graduated from Billings West High School in 1990 and went on to attend Graceland University in Lamoni, Iowa for a year.
