



Kenneth (Kenny) Bugbee was born September 29, 1927 to Frank and Millie (Sottendahl) Bugbee on a farm in Sherbook township of Steele County North Dakota. He helped his dad on the farm until he was 17 when he convinced his parents to sign for him so he could join the Navy in 1944. He was transferred to the Seabee's and joined the 144th NCB on their way to Attu in the Aleutian Islands. He was honorably discharged in 1946.

On July 27, 1949 he married Donna Mannie from Tolna, North Dakota. In 1952 they moved to Tioga where he worked in the oil fields for two years before being hired by Signal Oil & Gas at their new gas processing plant at Tioga in 1954 where he remained for over 36 years.
