




In Loving Memory Of

Tanner enjoyed hands on activities in school. He was in track as a freshman and excelled at distance running. As a sophomore, he enjoyed his machining class and auto tech classes. In his junior year, he got his first car and like most teenage boys, he had to install a stereo system.
