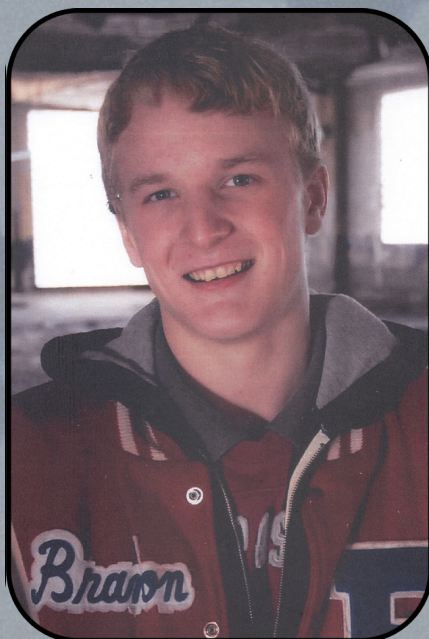
We Will Be Missing You
