Jim was born in Sidney, MT on October 30, 1953 to Dean and Cynthia (Ross) Dishon. Jim was the father of 4 children. He was raised and graduated from high school in Sidney, MT. It was here that he met his high school sweetheart, Donna Olson, and they were married on June 16, 1971.

Every year, Jim, his father, and his brother Dick would hunt every year when they were younger and it was a grin of his mother, and sister, Cynthia. Jim would always bring home some venison and his message was the best and most delicious which fortunately he supplied for his mother's successful hunts.
