

Cleo Charlene was born to Ralph Waldo and Constance Julia (Monson) Overstreet on October 31, 1942 in Williston, ND in a taxi on her way to the hospital. She was one of 9 children in a close knit family.



She was baptized in Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church in Alexander, ND on June 27th, 1946. Cleo attended a one room school house, some 2 1/2 miles away from her family's farm house from the 1st through 8th grade. She was the only one in her grade until the middle of 8th grade.

Cleo loved living her early days at the family farm, she had many chores; bringing in the eggs, herding the cows, washing dishes and riding a horse to get the mail. She spent most of her summer days swimming in


