At about the age of 5 she was placed in a state hospital in Grafton, ND where she remained for many years and then Mary Lou was moved to Williston in a group home. Mary Lou was very happy there and this made it easier for her parents to visit her.

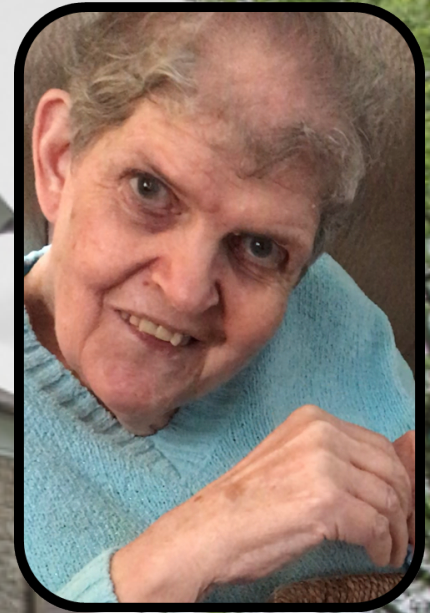
One of Mary Lou's favorite pastimes was listening to country music. Elvis Presley was her favorite artist and has all of his music.
