Now all we have is *Memories*

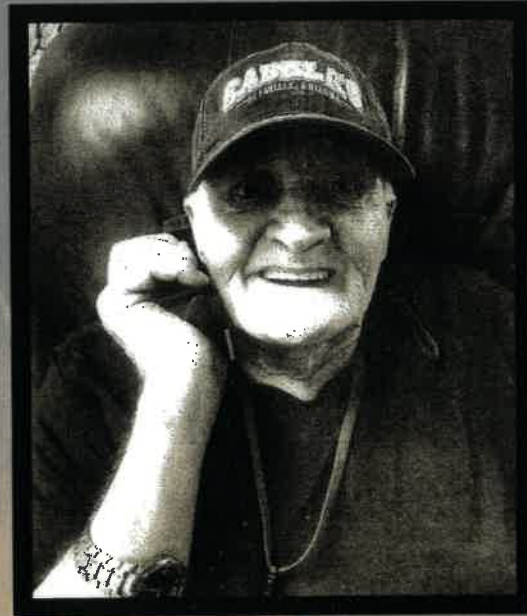
And your picture in a frame.
