Blanche Corrine (Borstad) Kjelvik was born on October 8, 1940 in Powers Lake, ND to Morris and Olga Borstad of rural Tioga. She went to local schools and graduated from Tioga High School, class of 1958. Corrine's love of music started in 2nd grade, when she went to a concert put on by the Minot State Symphony. She told her mother that she needed to play violin. For the next 11 years she took private lessons with Arturo Petrucci and began to play in that same symphony a few years later.

Corrine married Frank Beasley in 1958. They had three children, Lori, Troy and Todd.

Corrine graduated from Minot State College and was a K-6 music teacher, in Minot, ND. In 1968 she was arrested as a participant in the teachers strike. After that, she moved with her family to Minnesota and worked as a music teacher and orchestra director in Blaine.

Corrine married Bruce Kjelvik in 1978 and they had a son, Jared.

In 1987, she moved with her family to Arizona. She taught fiddle music and orchestra in Tempe. In 1989 she graduated from Arizona State University with a master's equivalency in music therapy. She became a certified music therapist and worked in group homes. She retired as a case manager for the Arizona Department of Developmental Disabilities. After her retirement, she and her husband, Bruce spent their time between their homes in Mesa, AZ and Tioga, ND.

On July 28, 2020 Bruce and Corrine passed away at their farmstead.

Corrine was preceded in death by her sister, Ardele; her son, Troy, and her parents, Morris and Olga Borstad. She is survived by her brother, Juris Borstad (Padgie) (Kalispell, MT); daughter, Lori Beasley (Mesa AZ); son, Todd Beasley (Valleri) (Tioga, ND); son, Jared Kjelvik (Renee) (Mesa AZ); step-son, Scott Kjelvik; step-daughter, Mikki Kjelvik, as well as grandchildren, great-grandchildren and two nephews.

Bruce Kjelvik was born on August 14, 1940 to Wilhelm Kjelvik and Betsy (Qually) Kjelvik in Fargo, North Dakota. He went to local schools and graduated from Central High in Fargo ND in 1958.

Bruce married Donna Nordstrom in 1958 and had two children, Scott Kjelvik and Mikki Kjelvik.

Bruce worked at the Fargo Forum newspaper while attending Dakota Business College. In the 1960's Bruce moved to the Minneapolis area and worked as a construction worker in the Ironworker and Piledriver Unions.

In the late 1960s Bruce co-founded Dune Buggy Enterprises with his partner Dick Whitman. D.B.E grew to have three locations in the Minneapolis area and was a supplier and manufacture of Dune Buggy kits and parts. After closing D.B.E. in 1974, Bruce became a heavy crane operator in the 49ers Union.

Bruce married Corrine Beasley in 1978 and they had a son, Jared.

From 1978 to the early 1980's, Bruce worked in the oil field and on the Borstad family farm, Tioga. In the mid 1980's Bruce became a long-haul trucker while working out of Fargo, ND until the early 1990's where he moved to Tempe, AZ and continued working in the trucking business. After retirement he and his wife Corrine spent time between their homes in Mesa, AZ and Tioga, ND.

On July 28, 2020 Bruce and Corrine passed away at their farmstead.
