Dawn recognized and championed this.

Dawn was a champion of recovery, reaching into every corner of North Dakota to tell the story. She touched so many lives with her generosity of spirit. She always took the time to visit a friend, take them to the movies, or to help them when life let them down.

She was amazing in her ability to juggle many tasks at once and still dream of the future. She was human, an Eastern Montana girl, who loved flower gardens, decorating her home, and driving with her car windows down. She loved her parents and grandparents above all else. She was strong in her belief of family and love of her husband Kevin.

The loss of Dawn Marie will be felt beyond that of her family, friends and coworkers. Dawn was a force that could move mountains and the whole world is smaller without her.

Dawn was greeted with open arms in Heaven, on Tuesday morning, February 10, 2009, from her home in Williston, ND by her maternal grandmother Helen Roberts; Pops, Jessie Roberts; and paternal grandfather Donald.
