

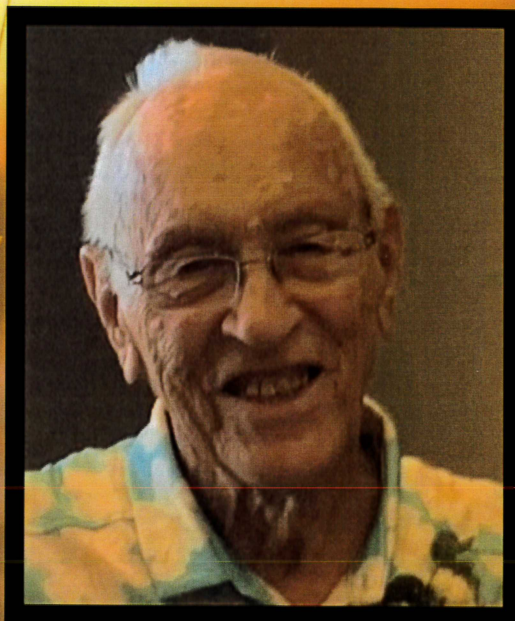
IN LOVING MEMORY OF OUR DEAR FATHER
