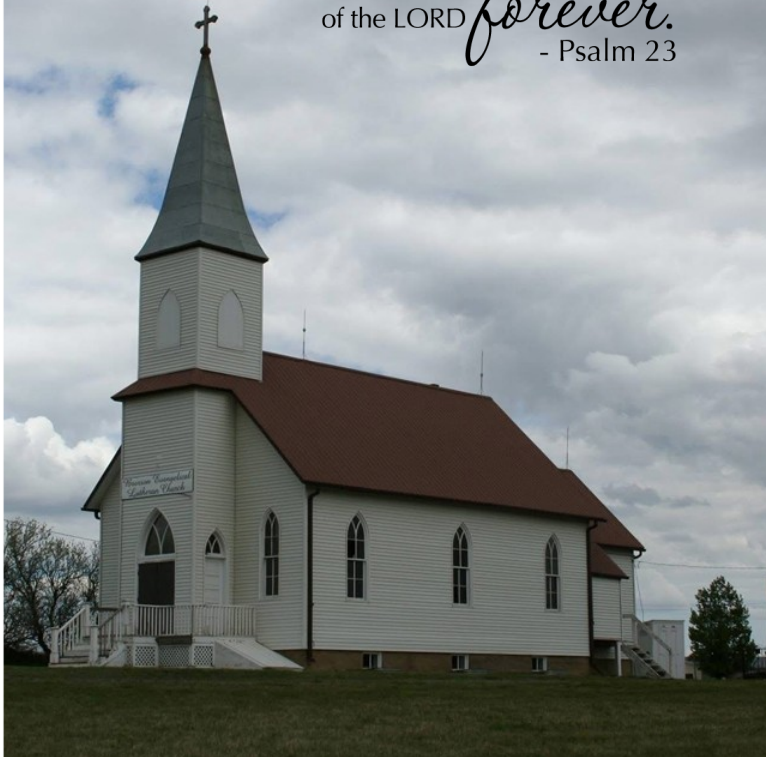

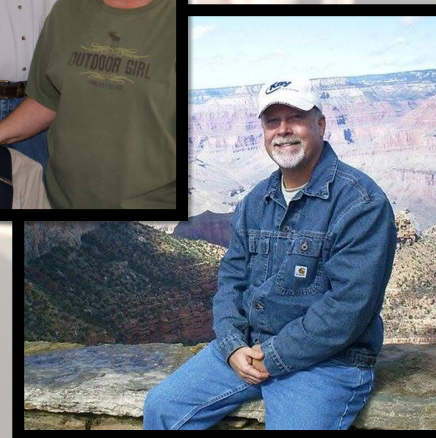

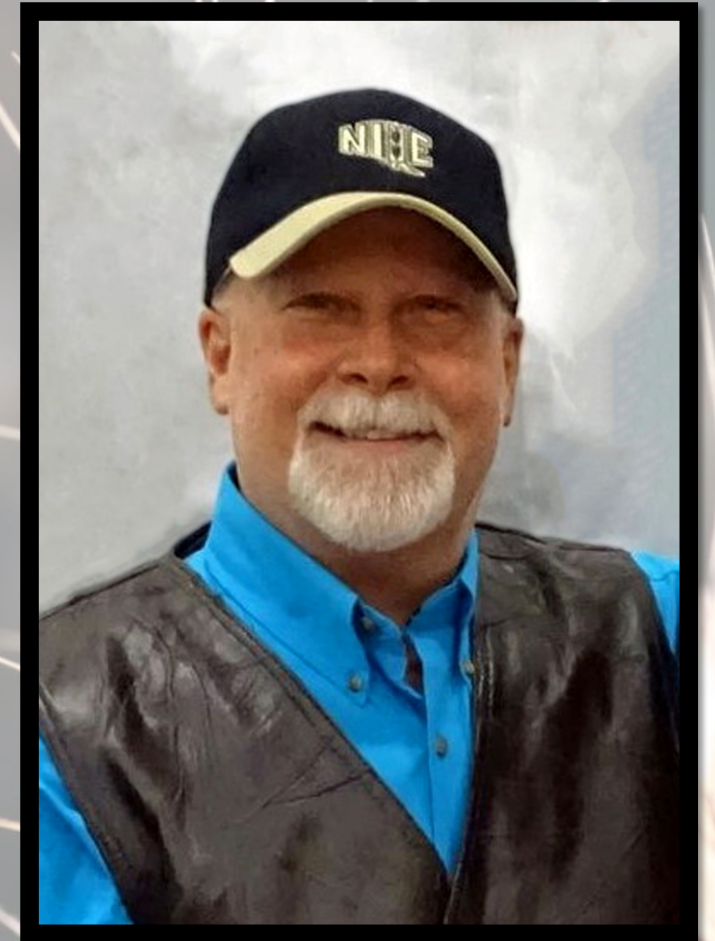

APRIL 18, 2025





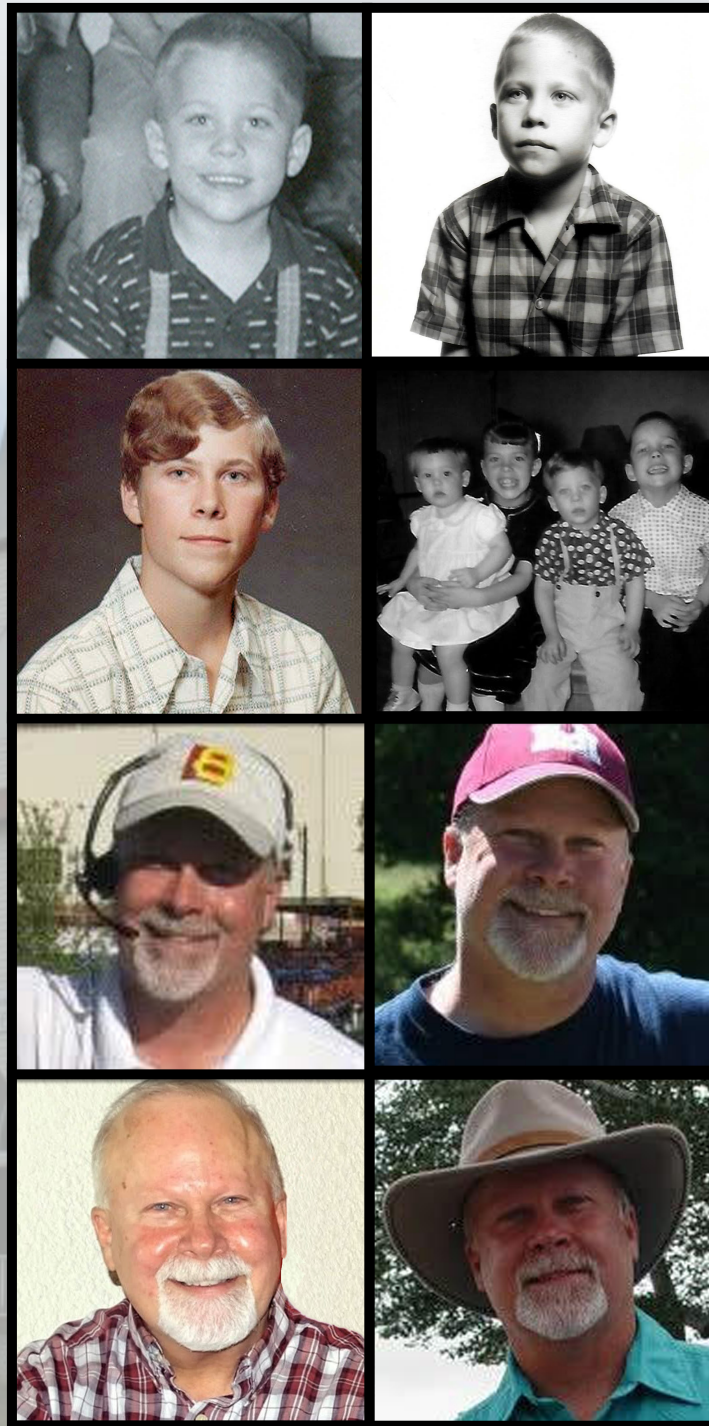
Larry Dean Larson was born July 25, 1957, in Sidney, Montana to Merrill and Eunice (Sundheim) Larson. He was the third of four children.
