Lynn Mortin Wahus, 93, passed away peacefully on Wednesday, May 7, 2025 at the Benedictine Living Center in Garrison, North Dakota.

Lynn was born to Lauriz "Louis" Johannesen Wahus and Inga Marie (Kyllo) Wahus on May 03, 1932, in Rural McKenzie County, North Dakota. After his mother's passing, he was raised by his father and sister Ruth in McKenzie County, North Dakota.
