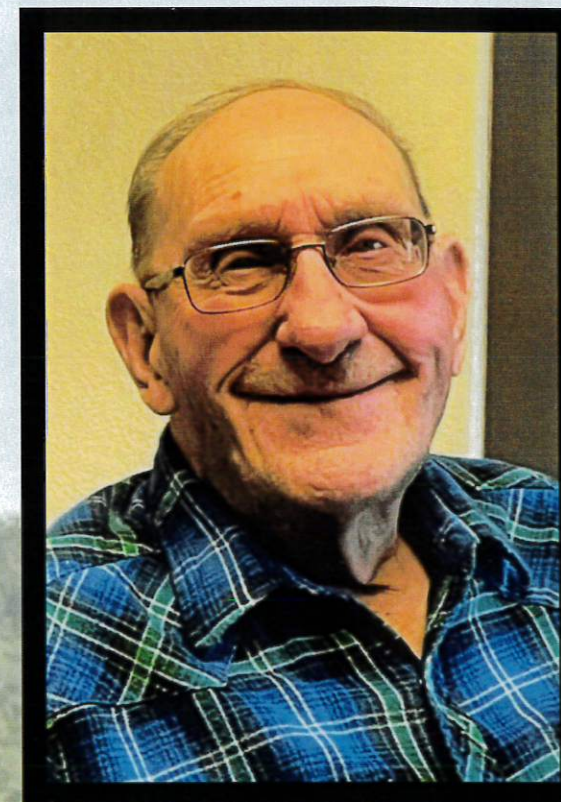

Curtis W. Anderson, 91, passed away on March 1, 2026, at CHI Medical Center in Williston, ND, surrounded by his family.

We will forever be grateful for their help; with just a phone call, they would be there, besides the days we spent with them. When it was time to leave after a visit, Curtis's goodbye was "See you later, Alligator," and our response, of course, was "In a while, crocodile." He had a great smile, and he was deeply loved and will be missed by all who loved him dearly.
