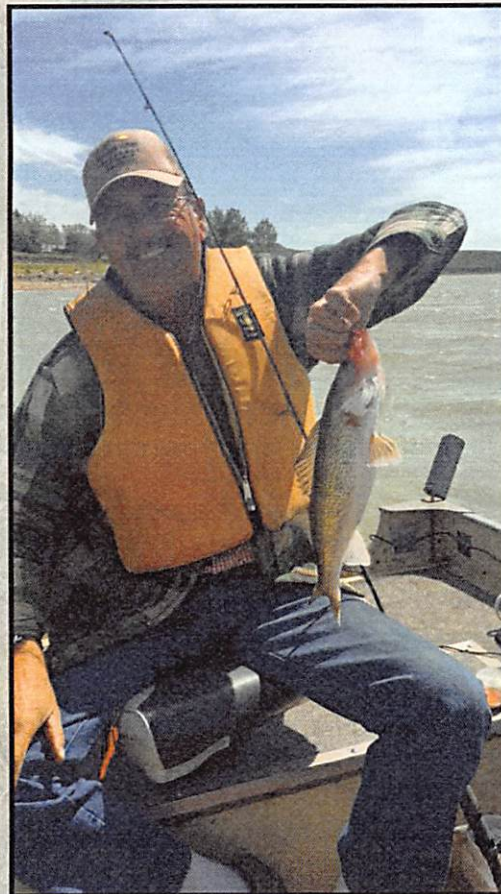

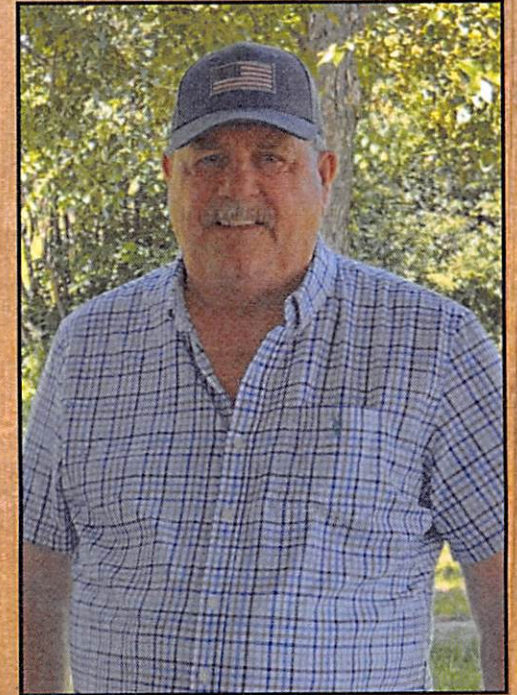

to head home.*

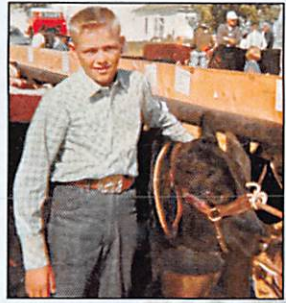

He proudly served in the Army National Guard for over six years. On March 16, 1974 he was united in marriage to Dorothy (Berg) Feiring at Faith Lutheran Church of rural Williston. Steve was baptized, confirmed, and a lifetime member of First Lutheran Church of White Earth. He was a member of the White Earth Wildcats 4-H Club, the American Angus Association, White Earth Saddle Club, Swing & Twirl Square Dance Club, and served on church council.

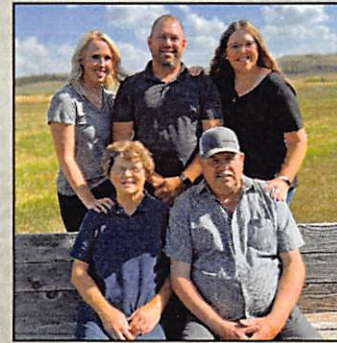
