

Jerome H. "Jerry" Torstenson was born May, 4, 1943 to Henry and Elva (Anklam) Torstenson in Williston, ND. He was raised on the family farm. He graduated from Watford City High School in 1961.

After graduation Jerry enlisted in the US Army. After basic training, he was sent to Germany where he served as a radar specialist and earned several marksman awards. He was honorably discharged in 1964.

Jerry returned to Watford City in 1965 and worked at Farmers Union for a short time before taking employment with Matador Service, which later became Koch Oil. He was employed as a truck driver, dispatcher, field rep, assistant foreman and district foreman. He and his family lived in Oklahoma, New Jersey, and Utah before returning home to farm in 1976. He also worked for Orrin's Bobcat Service while living in Watford City.

On August 11, 1966 Jerry married Judy Gravos at Wilmington Lutheran Church in Arnegard, North Dakota. From this union two children were born, Jan Renae (Torstenson) Lynch born in Enid Oklahoma, and Jared Ryan Torstenson, born in Williston, North Dakota. The couple divorced in 1984.


