

Donald A. Rider was born on June 29, 1921 in a tar-papered shack on the Tony Dietrich farm at Sioux Crossing, North Dakota. He was the 7th child out of 13 children born to John and Goldie (Johnson) Rider.

He was raised in the Fairview and Cartwright area and attended the Dean School until the 8th grade. In his memoirs he wrote, "When I was seven I went out to the beet field where the rest were thinning beets dad said, 'Can you tell the beets from the weeds?' I made the mistake and said yes, and dad said get to work. From then on I helped in the beets."

In the spring on 1938, he joined the CCCs and was stationed south of Watford City where he worked on the development of the North Unit of Theodore Roosevelt National Park. On July 24, 1943 he joined the Navy Seabees as a Machinists Mate Second Class and was stationed in Hawaii. He was discharged on February 24, 1946 and received the Asiatic Area Campaign Medal One Star, the American Campaign Medal and the World War Victory Medal. He returned to Kalama, Washington area and worked different jobs until he ended back in North Dakota.

In the fall of 1947, Don met Ruth Dow. They went together until August 22, 1948 when they were married. This was the start of their amazing love and life together. They moved to the Buford area and began farming and raising their three children, Byron, Barb and Donald H.

Don was also involved in a variety of community organizations: he was a member of the Odd Fellows where he enjoyed playing cards; he was elected to the Buford - Trenton Irrigation District board in 1959 where he served 17 years, the last ten years was as chairman; and he was a member of Trinity Lutheran Church until recently when he became a member of Concordia Lutheran Church.

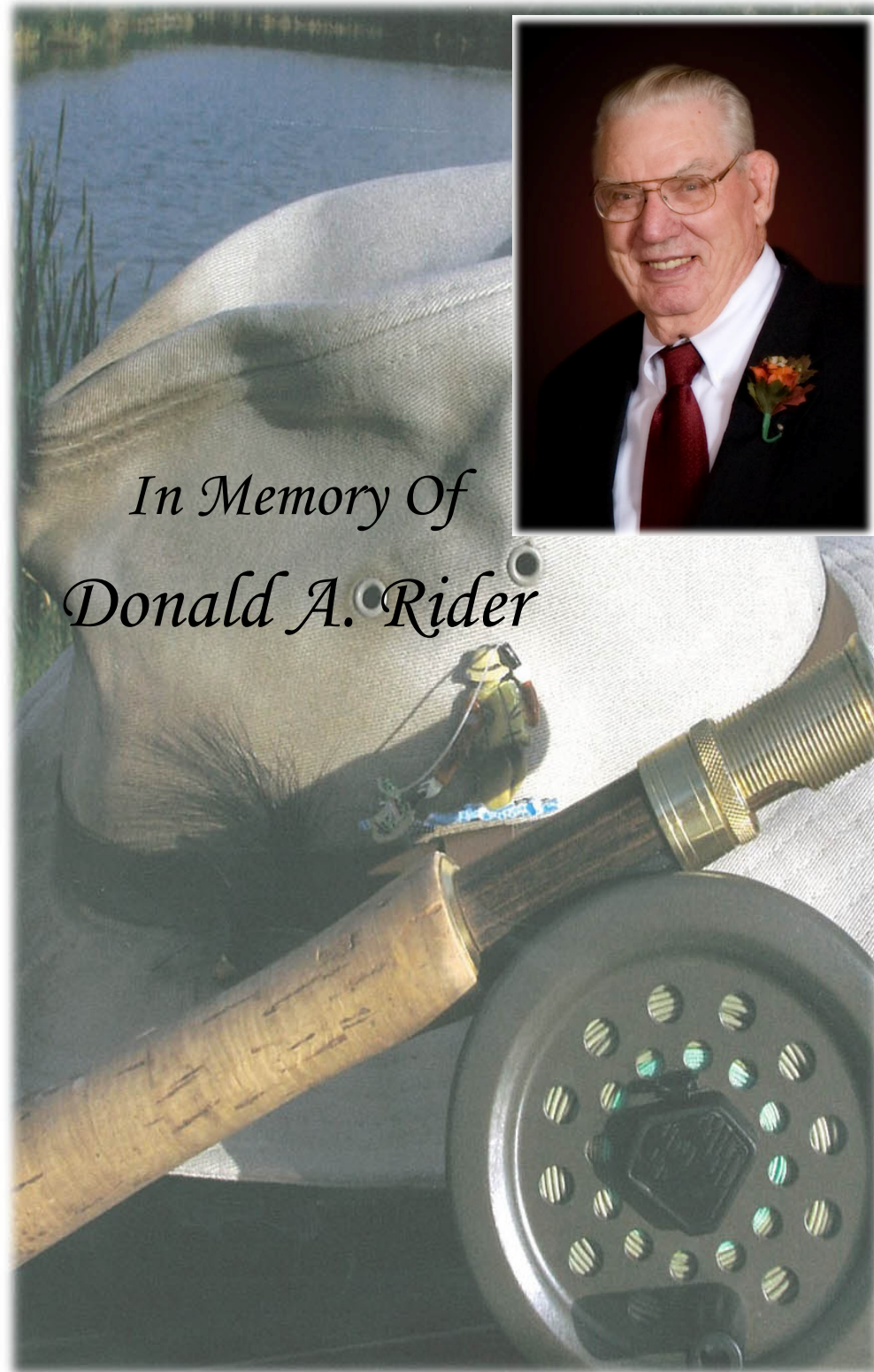

Rider of rural Williston; his brother, Gary Rider of Kalama, WA; and his sisters, Beverly Johnson of Longview, WA and Jean Neuman of Kalama, WA; his grandchildren, Jed (Melissa) Rider, Adam (Jenny) Rider, Jonie (Jamie) Slater, Kalie Rider, Robyn Kummer, Wade (Katie) Kummer, Tanya (Kyle) Taylor, Cory Kummer, Lacey (Travis) Cote, Levi Rider and Logan Rider; and 11 great grandchildren. He will also be missed by his tie-fishing buddy, Randy Pitzer.
